Participant Behavior Expectations Contract

The expected participant behavior for Lose The Training Wheels Bike Camp is to show respect to all participants & staff during programs.

The participant will demonstrate appropriate behaviors as listed in the *Participants Rules of Conduct for Recreation and Parks Program* for Howard County Maryland Recreation and Parks Department. **The following will not be tolerated in any Recreation and Parks program:**

- Food and beverages in unauthorized areas; glass containers are prohibited
- Smoking in building
- Soliciting or loitering
- Interference with employee or volunteer duties
- Harassment and/or inappropriate or indecent conduct or language
- Unauthorized use of illegal drugs, intoxicants, and weapons
- Parking in unauthorized areas; driving or parking on field areas
- Alteration or installation of equipment (basketball hoops, fences, margins, linings, etc.)
- Defacing property (indoors or outdoors)
- Any other conduct that may jeopardize the safety of others

Specific rules may be added for individual programs and needs. These rules of conduct are in conjunction with the Howard County Board of Education.

HCRP staff will inform xxxxx of the program expectations at the beginning of the program.

- Zero incidents of aggression or threats of aggression during programs.
- To show respect to all participants & staff during programs.

The Department of Recreation and Parks reserves the right to limit, deny, or expel a participant when the health and/or safety of the individual, other participants, staff, volunteers, and/or the public are threatened. Decisions to limit, deny, or expel a participant may be based on any of the following behavior situations:

- Repeated and unresolved disciplinary problems that require excessive staff intervention (e.g. problems that cannot be controlled through behavior modification techniques.)
- Involvement in any activity that is contraindicated for medical reasons.
- Behavior that hinders the safe operation of a vehicle.
- Behavior that presents danger for the participant, other participants, or the staff/volunteers.
- Actions that persist after a behavior modification plan and an agreement has been implemented.
