

What are Autism Spectrum Disorders?

"Autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is a developmental disability that can cause significant social, communication and behavioral challenges.

There is often nothing about how an individual with ASD looks that sets he/she apart from others, but individuals with ASD may communicate, interact, behave, and learn differently from most other individuals. The learning, thinking, and problem-solving abilities of individuals with ASD can range from gifted to severely challenged. Some individuals with ASD need a lot of help in their daily lives; others need less." [CDC 2014]

Characteristics of Autism

While it is easy to generalize about characteristics, no two individuals with autism are alike.

- ⇒ You cannot tell by appearance alone that someone has autism.
- ⇒ Autism is diagnosed by behavioral characteristics. Children with autism typically have difficulties in three main areas:
 1. Social interaction
 2. Communication
 3. Repetitive or restrictive behavior patterns
- ⇒ Symptoms present before age 3.

Did You Know?

In Howard County, more than 8% of the special education population has an autism spectrum disorder (state average is 4%).

National prevalence is estimated at 1 in 68 births;*
in Maryland it is about 1 in 60.**

Serving Families and Community

Monthly Support Group Meetings: General Support Group, Aspergers Support Group, Transition Group. Many meetings feature a guest speaker.

Social Outings help prevent family isolation. Activities include but are not limited to: swimming parties, family fitness nights, rock climbing and parent nights out.

Autism Trainings are offered to community service providers including Howard County General Hospital, Howard County Police Department, Howard County Fire and Rescue, Howard County Recreation and Parks, and Howard County Libraries.

Educational Workshops are offered on a variety of issues related to autism, therapies, special education, research, and assistive technology.

AMC Sensory Friendly Movies offer children with an autism spectrum disorder and others a chance to enjoy a movie where the volume is lowered, the lights are up, and everyone is free to move around.

Sensory Friendly Santa & Easter Bunny allow children to enjoy these holiday favorites in a quiet, well lit mall, with no waiting in line, and when few shoppers are around.

911 Alert is a collaboration with the Howard County Police department that offers parents the opportunity to flag their home in the 911 Call System so first responders will know that a child with autism lives there and the first responder can act appropriately.
